STRATEGY STATEMENT
<p>Our Catch-up Premium Strategy aims to ensure that all children make accelerated progress in core subjects. Our priorities are reading, writing and maths. By splitting classes into groups of 15, we are creating a higher teacher to pupil ratio in order to tailor learning to individual pupils and provide a more bespoke programme of learning. We have spent some of the CCPG money on IT equipment in these classes to allow teachers to access both groups and to use the E-learning strategy and software across both home and school learning in order to produce a blended wholistic, approach to the pupils education.</p> <p>This approach will lead to a reduction in the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and their non-disadvantaged peers. We also aim to raise the attainment of all pupils and thereby close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures</p>
